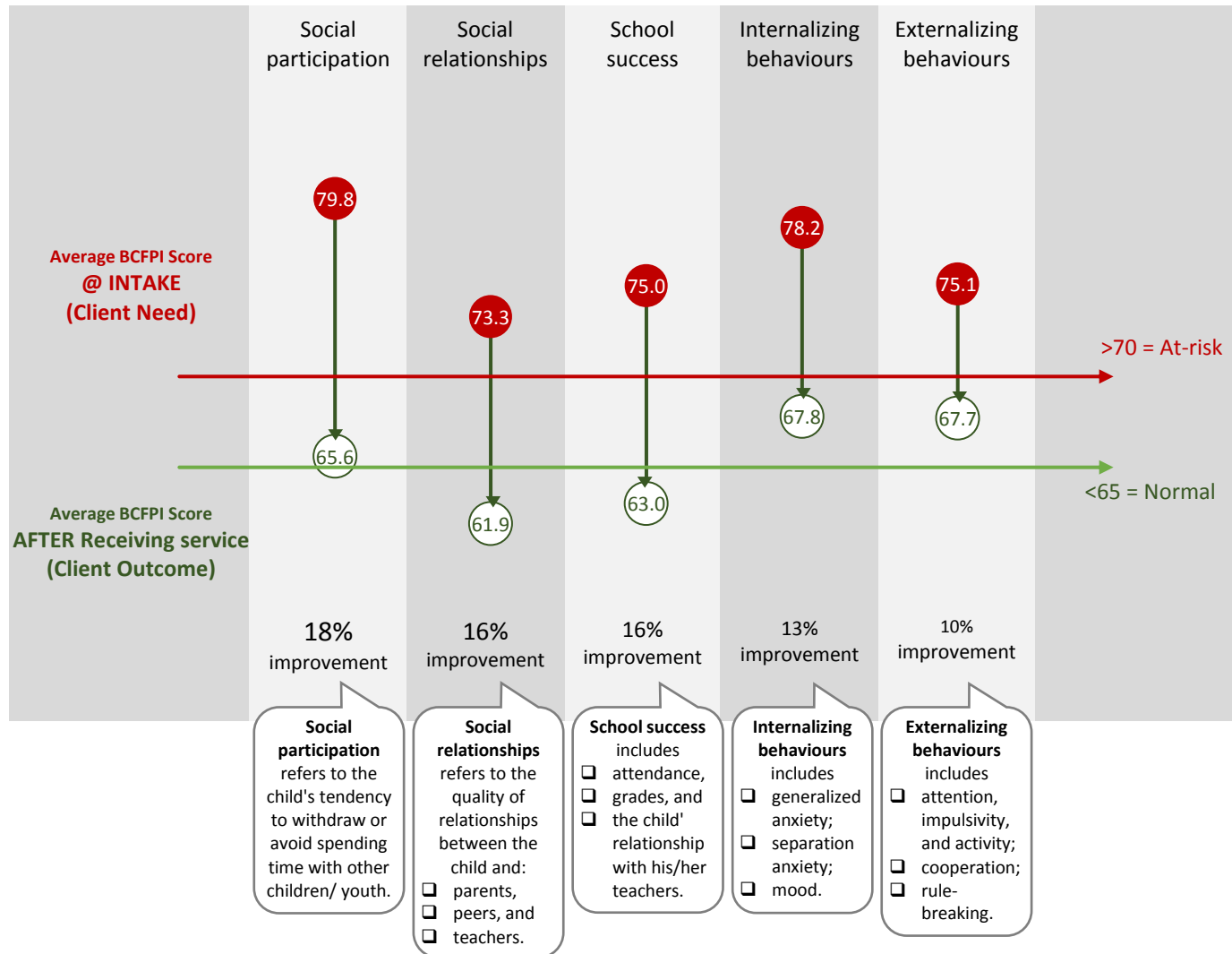


Using BCFPI to measure Mental Health programs effectiveness

Client outcomes scores show improvement in symptoms/behaviours since receiving service.



AT-RISK

BCFPI scores greater than 70 for a given problem/symptom indicate a need for clinical intervention. Less than two percent (2%) of the general population would be expected to score greater than 70 for any given problem/symptom.

NORMAL

BCFPI scores less than 65 are considered "Normal." Ninety-three percent (93%) of the general population would be expected to score less than 65 for any given problem/symptom.

Average BCFPI scores for all children/youth as reported by Parents for all CKCS Mental Health programs. Outcomes data collected April 1, 2016-March 31, 2017 (fiscal).
